## National Gambling Support Network

Whether you're looking for support for yourself or for someone you care about, the National Gambling Support Network (NGSN) is here to help.





The National Gambling Support Network (NGSN) is a network of organisations across England, Scotland and Wales. They provide free treatment, advice and support on a range of gambling-related issues.

Support is available for anyone experiencing gambling harms, as well as for family and friends affected by someone else's gambling.

## **How the NGSN can help**

- Accessing the right support: With providers across England, Wales and Scotland, the NGSN can help you find the right local support tailored to your individual situation and preferences.
- Flexible, tailored support: Support will be offered to help you make a plan tailored to your needs but just like any journey, that route can change. The NGSN has a wide range of services and will be there to guide you at every step.
- Judgement-free support: Staff and counsellors across the NGSN providers are trained in supporting people experiencing gambling harms and many have lived experience of gambling harms themselves.

## Types of treatment the NGSN offers

There are lots of support options available through the NGSN. Trained staff will work with you to find the one that's right for you within a judgement-free environment.

There are national and regional providers that together cover the whole of England, Scotland and Wales. Included within this are a range of

services designed for specific communities or groups, such as womenonly services.

Some types of support available through the NGSN include:

- Therapy and counselling: Therapy sessions are one of the support options available through the NGSN. These sessions might be one-to-one treatment or group sessions with a qualified practitioner. Sessions might be face-to-face or online depending on the services offered by your local providers.
- Peer support: This service provides the option to speak to trained peer support workers who have overcome gambling harms of their own. Sessions are available in one-to-one settings or as part of a group.
- Residential centres: If you feel you need to go to a residential centre, you'll need to check in for a period of time. Treatment is free, but you might need to pay towards the costs of your stay. Do not let that stop you from getting in contact. Each provider can help you work through different options to get you the right support.

#### How effective has the NGSN been?

- 20,754 people found support and treatment through the NGSN in 2024
- Over 110,000 people supported since the NGSN launched in April 2023
- On average, people seeking support for issues with gambling were offered a first assessment within two days
- 95% of those who completed treatment saw improvements in the level of gambling harm they were experiencing
- Self-referrals directly into provider services has increased by over 50% since the NGSN launched

#### **Contacting the NGSN**

Whether you're looking for support for yourself or for someone you care about, the NGSN is here to help. There are providers based across England, Scotland and Wales so you can access support close to you.



## What services does Adferiad offer?

- Initial assessment
- One-to-one sessions with a practitioner
- Group sessions
- Family therapy
- 1hr training session for women to raise awareness of gambling harms
- Weekly drop-in sessions for women experiencing gambling harms
- An initial stay, if required, at Hafan Wen, a medically managed detoxification unit with 24/7 staff
- 4 week residential stay at Parkland Place, which offers a therapeutic rehab programme to address gambling addiction
- 6 week aftercare programme

#### What services does Aquarius offer?

- Support for individuals: One-to-one, personalised support for those facing gambling problems

## **Outreach and community engagement**


- Aquarius raises awareness and promotes support services through training, team talks and information stands

- Training for young people: Bespoke training to raise awareness in schools and youth settings







Ara recovery for all is the NGSN regional provider for **Wales and South West England** for those affected by gambling-related harm or those affected by someone else's gambling.

#### What services does Ara recovery for all offer?

Free and confidential assessment, support and treatment for those experiencing gambling-related harms, or affected by someone else's gambling. This support can be delivered face-to-face, online or by telephone.

Ara recovery for all provides online recovery management workshops to ensure that recovery lasts, including peer support through its lived experience partners within the NGSN.

- Training Ara recovery for all provides free training to organisations and professionals to help with increased awareness, knowledge and skills, to identify, support and refer individuals experiencing gambling-related harms, including those from the criminal justice, Armed Forces and ethnic minority communities
- Workplace charter Ara recovery for all provides free training to organisations to better support their workforce, including support to develop workplace policies related to gambling harms and how to refer colleagues for support





Beacon Counselling Trust offers free gambling-related harms support and education in the **North West**.

## What services does Beacon Counselling Trust offer?

- **Support** for those at risk from or experiencing gambling harms, or those affected by someone else's gambling behaviour
- Long-term recovery options including peer support and Trek Therapy
- 'Bet You Can Help' educational programme to support professionals.
   This will raise awareness, help identify gambling-related harms and support people into treatment. Provision of specialist content for key target groups across the criminal justice system, Armed Forces community and diverse communities.
- 'Sometimes It's More Than a Game' programme providing free workshops for young people aged 10 to 21 alongside sessions for parents and carers
- 'Workplace Charter to Reduce Gambling-Related Harm' to assist employers with developing frameworks and policies to support staff in the workplace
- Giving lived experience a voice with the 'Lived Experience Alliance'
- Armed Forces Gambling Support Network Programme, led by Beacon Counselling Trust, provides free gambling-related harms training for professionals supporting the Armed Forces community, and free and confidential specialist treatment and support for any currently serving personnel or veterans who may be experiencing gambling-related harms



Betknowmore UK provides support for those experiencing gambling harms, including affected others, **across Great Britain**, with its services combining lived experience and evidence-based therapeutic approaches.

#### What services does Betknowmore offer?

A specialist provider of peer-led and community outreach support and training services, Betknowmore UK provides three services as part of the NGSN:

- Peer Aid a service where individuals harmed by gambling receive support from Peer Supporters, who themselves have fully recovered from gambling harms and have received City & Guilds assured training
- New Beginnings a unique service, co-designed by women for women experiencing gambling harms, combining bespoke one-toone and group support, facilitated by women with lived experience
- Gambling Outreach and Living Support (GOALS) this service enhances community resilience to gambling harms by working with local authorities, statutory and voluntary partners to deliver strategic and operational activities (e.g. strategy workshops, training and drop-ins), while partnership with the Primary Care Gambling Service provides an integrated pathway of support and aftercare

Betknowmore UK provides a variety of training sessions and workshops aimed at raising awareness of gambling harms. These initiatives include tailored support for the Armed Forces community and Black communities, as well as:

- Worksafe Continuing Professional Development (CPD) accredited training to prevent gambling harms in the workplace, ensuring employers protect their business and support the mental, physical and financial wellbeing of their employees
- 'Bet You Can Help' gambling harms awareness training accredited by the Royal Society for Public Health, and designed to equip staff teams working in the community with the knowledge and skills to tackle gambling harms
- Local authorities comprehensive strategic and operational services,
   tailored for the needs of their local communities

# Breakeven

Breakeven is the provider for those affected by gambling harms in the **East of England, Sussex, Kent and Medway.** 

#### What services does Breakeven offer?

- Support for the person affected by gambling harms, or affected by someone else's gambling behaviour
- Weekly drop-in online support group for women who gamble and for women affected by someone's gambling (WINGS)
- Aftercare groups for those who have successfully stopped gambling and require extra supported learning following treatment (Green Shoots Recovery, and the Growth Hub)
- Peer Support from a Breakeven counsellor who uses their lived experience to inspire hope for those starting and continuing their journey of recovery
- 'Bet You Can Help' educational programme to support professionals.
   This will raise awareness, help identify gambling-related harms and support people into treatment. Provision of specialist content for key target groups across the criminal justice system, Armed Forces community and diverse communities.
- No waiting list Breakeven will see you promptly, with initial contact typically made within one day

GamCare provides free, flexible treatment services via phone, video call, or in person for adults across London, South East, East Midlands, Yorkshire & Humber, and Central Scotland.

#### What services does GamCare offer?

- **Support** for people who gamble and affected others, including friends and family members
- Fast access first contact made in an average of 2.1 days after referral
- Person-centred care focused on your wellbeing and safety, and understanding your goals, without fear of judgment
- Evidence-based therapies including Cognitive Behavioural Therapy (CBT) and motivational interviewing
- One-to-one treatment and group sessions delivered by phone,
   video call or in person preparing for change
- Ongoing recovery support with aftercare, relapse prevention and peer-led programmes
- Financial support including budgeting help and GamCare's Money Guidance Service
- Referrals to specialist services, such as NHS Gambling Clinics and residential treatment providers







The Primary Care Gambling Service (PCGS) is a **nationwide** treatment provider for adults experiencing gambling harm.

#### What services does PCGS offer?

- PCGS provides holistic support to those experiencing gambling harms, considering a patient's psychological, physical and social needs as well as their gambling behaviour
- PCGS takes a multidisciplinary approach to treatment to empower patients and ensure they receive the appropriate care
- PCGS offers one-to-one care and group support sessions, including men-only groups, women-only groups, mixed groups and neurodivergent group sessions designed for those with ASD (autism spectrum disorder) and ADHD (attention deficit hyperactivity disorder)
- Support is also available for affected others impacted by someone else's gambling
- Aftercare planning is performed from the start of treatment, with regular reviews up to 12 months after treatment finishes to reduce the risk of relapse
- Since 2022, PCGS has collaborated with the Royal College of General Practitioners to deliver a programme designed to improve early identification and management of people at risk of gambling harms, comprised of training courses, practice accreditation and the Gambling Harms Hub
